Critical review: 'MUD in pipes, eccentric orbits and interesting facts'

On the other hand, it definitely has to be mentioned that the structure and organisation of his slides were remarkable, specially taking into account the personal problems he mentioned in the beginning of the presentation. The slides looked as if they had been worked on for a while, the fonts were adequate, and so were the range of colours chosen. They also include both text and images, which made it quite easy to follow the presentation in an engaged way. Nevertheless, some images did not include the source, and neither did some figures that were extracted from scientific papers.
